What you will be doing

As a Career Coach, you will report to the Head of People and primarily focus on supporting Sea Rangers in navigating their next career move. Your role involves taking Sea Rangers out of the day-to-day ship routine, guiding them to reflect on their experiences. Together with each Sea Ranger you will go through the Sea Ranger Career Coaching Programme, helping them discover more about themselves and identifying a suitable next step. In essence, you provide our Sea Rangers with the guidance they need to kickstart their maritime careers!

Your tasks include

- Guiding Sea Rangers through the Sea Ranger Career Coaching Programme;
- Coordinating individual needs and identifying when someone needs additional support.
- Teaching Sea Rangers effective techniques for job hunting and applying for positions.
- Coming up with ideas for potential employer work visits, internship days, or guest lectures;
- Ensuring each Sea Ranger properly reports their progress, and keeping their coaching dossier up-to-date;
- Keeping the Head of People informed about individual and overall progress.

The Sea Ranger Service is a maritime ranger service. Using sailing work ships, we carry out nature management tasks on behalf of the government and offshore companies. These tasks are performed by Sea Rangers—young adults selected and trained annually after participating in the Sea Ranger Bootcamp. Sea Rangers carry out nature monitoring and restoration work at sea, while learning on the job and furthering their own development.

Experience requirements

- You are a career coach with a proven track record of working with young individuals;
- You are registered as a qualified career development professional;
- You have knowledge of evidence-based strategies and conversation techniques for coaching interventions;
- You are empathetic and realise each person has their own story and future ambitions;
- You recognise potential in others and possess the ability to motivate them to take action towards their goals;
- You are able to work independently when required;
- You have affinity with the social impact mission of the Sea Ranger Service;
- Experience with social enterprises and/or companies in maritime industries is advantageous;
- You are residing in the Port Talbot/Neath area.
